Connect deeply—Contribute widely - Scripture text: Romans 15:23-33

In Paul's missionary work, what was his approach? (Following the text of Rom. 15:23-33.)

- 1) Create a team (vv. 23-24)
- 2) Complete priorities first (vv. 25-26)
- 3) Cultivate unity (vv. 27-29)
- 4) Cover with prayer (vv. 30-33).

How to measure results like Paul:

- 1) More people are engaged in God's work.
- 2) The most important work gets done first.
- 3) Deep gospel connections and wide family contributions.
- 4) Through prayer, we join in each other's struggles and share God's peace.

Breakout sessión:

- 1) Ask for assistance—God's people resource God's vision (vv. 23-24).
- 2) Do not waver from important work that God has called you to do. Prioritize and keep your promises (vv. 25-26).
- 3) Unity requires us to safeguard who we are in Christ.

 Balance strong biblical conviction with figuring out how we can partner together (vv. 27-29).
- 4) A quote attributed to Hudson Taylor says:
 - "When we work, we work. When we pray, God works" (vv. 30-33).
